

Proposed Multi-Use Path

Between Culebra Road and Blanco Rd



The proposed multi-use path is part of the Alamo RMA's Context Sensitive Solutions (CSS) approach. The concept for the path was identified by members of the Community Advisory Group who suggested using part of the right-of-way as a means of connecting the Salado Creek and Leon Creek greenways. They envisioned a bicycle/pedestrian facility in the right-of-way but separated from the roadway by a soft barrier of native shrubs, trees, and vegetation.

The multi-use path is included in Build Alternatives 1, 2, and 3, along with improvements at interchanges and intersections to better facilitate the safe movement of cyclists and pedestrians. The path extends about 15.5 miles and allows for connections with existing and planned on-street facilities (bike lanes/routes) and off-street trails (greenways and parks with bicycle trails). It also serves pedestrian and cyclist frequented destinations like UTSA and provides the needed infrastructure to route pedestrian and cyclist traffic to a future facility that would extend to the Government Canyon State Natural Area.
